

TASC (Treatment Alternatives for Safe Communities) advances health and justice, increases public safety, and saves taxpayer dollars by diverting eligible individuals out of costly systems and into substance use treatment and other services in the community.

Youth and family services

We offered specialized case management and care coordination for:

- 2,576 children, parents, and families to support their health and self-sufficiency in the community
- 554 young people to reduce their future involvement in the justice system



Alternatives to incarceration and community reentry services

We facilitated access to services, reducing likelihood of recidivism for:

- 2,579 men and women in alternative-to-incarceration programs
- 7,591 men and women returning to communities following incarceration
