

TASC (Treatment Alternatives for Safe Communities) advances health and justice, increases public safety, and saves taxpayer dollars by diverting eligible individuals out of costly systems and into substance use treatment and other services in the community.

TASC's in-depth services include:



Youth and family services

We offered specialized case management and care coordination for more than:

- 2,300 children, parents, and families to support their health and self-sufficiency in the community
- 500 young people to reduce their future involvement in the justice system



Alternatives to incarceration and community reentry services

We facilitated access to services, reducing likelihood of recidivism for more than:

- 1,500 men and women in alternative-to-incarceration programs
- 8,700 men and women returning to communities following incarceration



Access to substance use disorder treatment

- More than 550 men and women received TASC's intensive outpatient treatment, outpatient treatment, and/or continuing care services in Chicago, Springfield, Rockford, Belleville, and Edwardsville
- Across all programs, TASC made a total of 6,859 treatment referrals, resulting in more than 5,000 admissions
